Artists in residence, classroom projects and after school activities assist in bringing learning to life at Sunrise! We look forward to partnering with you over the coming year!

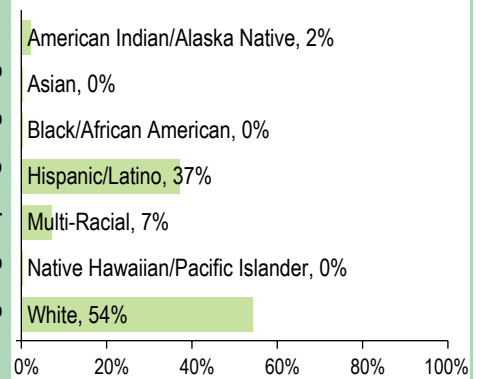

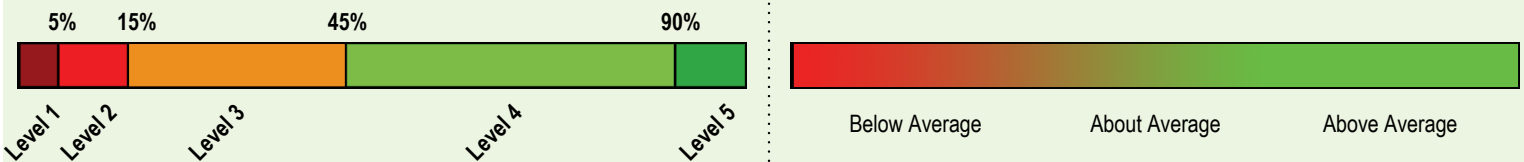
